From the Designated Pastor Nominating Committee

The search for our Designated Pastor continues. The Great Resignation has had implications for all types of work, and that includes ministry as well. Each month we have requested a new match from the Church Leadership Connection. Last month's match yielded 10 candidates, but only one responded to phone and email outreach to let us know that they were in discernment about another call.

The positive news is that we are moving forward to a 2nd interview with a candidate, and a first interview with a candidate who was referred to us by our Transitional Executive Presbyter, Dr. Flo Barbee-Watkins. Our team continues to explore every possibility, work collaboratively as a group, and to proceed with patience and deliberation. We ask that the congregation surround the process in prayer – for the discernment of our search committee and the candidates we consider. Please continue to be steadfast in commitment to building up this congregation and its ministries, and in your own spiritual formation. Pastoral candidates are considering these things as they discern a call.

Clerk's Session Notes - April

Session met at the church and the Moderator, Rev. Budge Gere, opened the meeting with prayer. Word-Share-Prayer was presented by Nancy Ryan using Luke 24: 13-16, 28-35, the biblical account of The Walk to Emmaus.

The Clerk reported that as of Tuesday, April 19, 2022, 65 member surveys have been returned. If you did not receive a survey, please let the church office know.

A Special Meeting of the Congregation was held on April 10, 2022 and approved Session's recommendation that initial conversations continue with parties interested in the potential purchase of the church properties located at 100 Hall Street, 102 E. McKay Street and 155 E. Michigan Avenue. Prior to the vote the Moderator reminded the congregation that while the Session provides leadership in church matters, issues surrounding the acquisition and disposition of church real estate require congregational and presbytery involvement and final approval.
